In this pedagogical Professional Development Workshop, we will demonstrate, with the help of participants, a sustainable Lego adaptation of the Billington (2004) lean paper airplane activity. In this activity, we will first illustrate student workers and their roles, materials needed, the room set-up, the pre-game discussion questions, and tips for running the scenarios. Next, we will illustrate the traditional push system where participants can readily see a build-up of work-in-process at the designed bottleneck station. The push scenario concludes with a discussion of a series of post push questions. We then add Kanbans to the production floor and run a pull three scenario and a pull one scenario. During the pull scenarios, a cadence will be observed as workers only produce when the downstream Kanban is empty. We conclude the activity with a discussion on how to improve the bottleneck, the simplifying assumptions we make to run the activity and student learning. We have received positive feedback from our undergraduate and graduate students regarding the pedagogical value of the activity and we will share these results.

Fully analyzing data requires an analyst to try out a wide variety of data visualizations, analyses, and modeling techniques. The insights gleaned from each of these leads the analyst to a next set of visualizations and analyses to try, and so on. The nature of analyzing data in today's data-rich world has moved away from what was once approached as "choose a technique to address a specific hypothesis" to "explore the data in myriad ways to extract features and insights". This exploration approach to data analysis and modeling can become cumbersome in a coding environment. Without very strong knowledge of a programming language, students often get frustrated as they find themselves unable to try out many different analyses or visualization that comes to mind without having to look up coding

instructions. In this presentation, a statistical scientist from JMP Software will illustrate how easy it can be to explore data by quickly creating a wide variety of interactive visualizations, analyses, predictive models and text mining in a "no code" environment. The audience will see how this approach not only greatly expedites data analyses, but provides students with a much richer and more engaging experience to learning analytics.

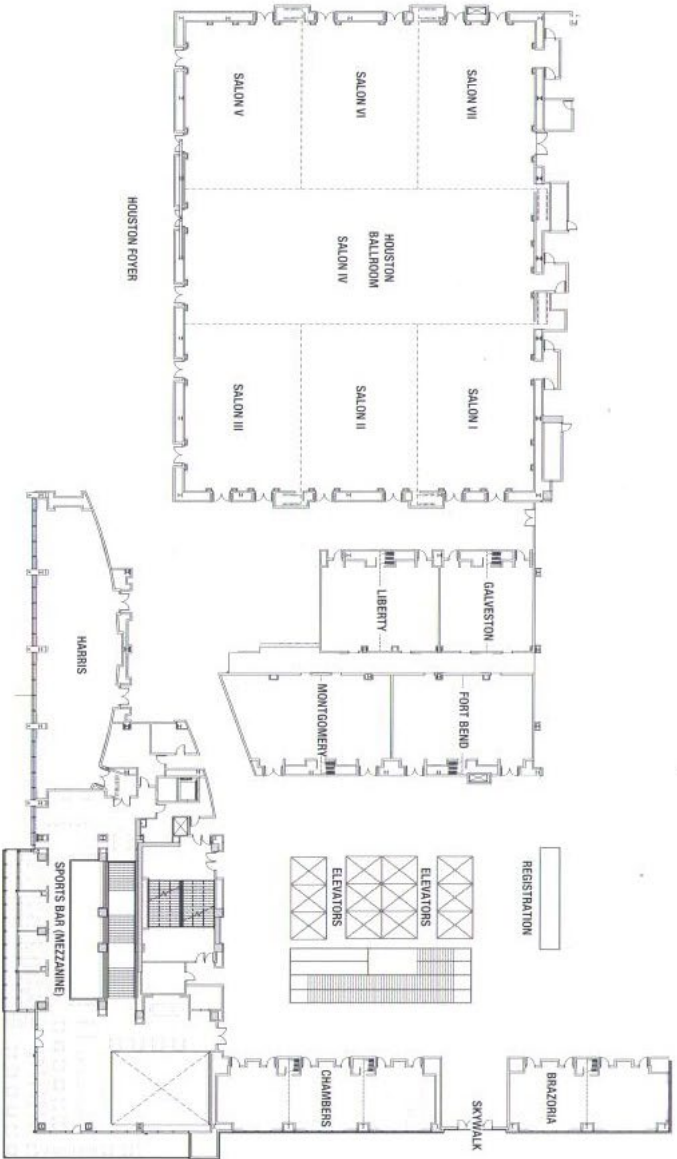
